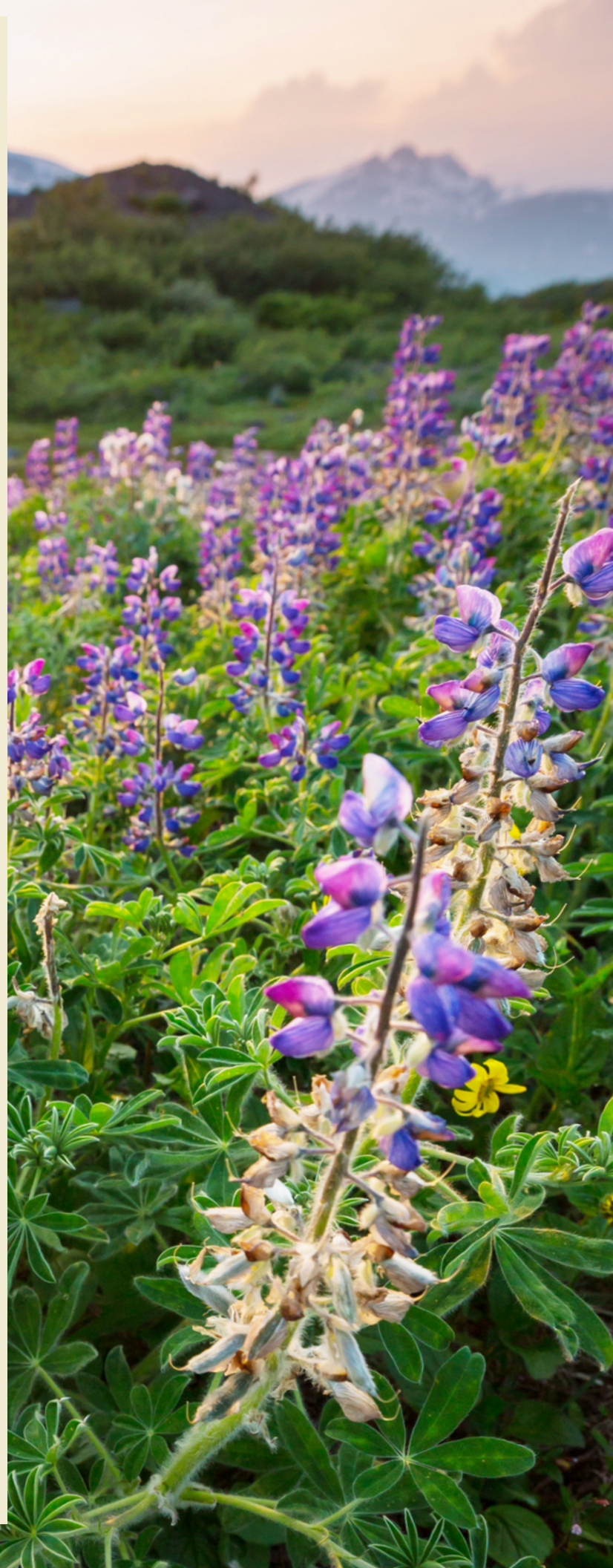

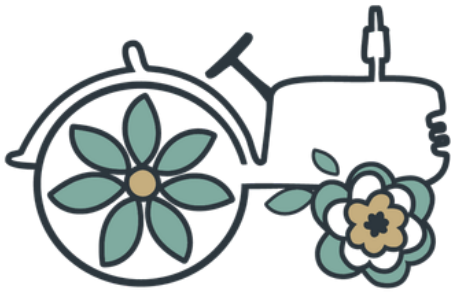

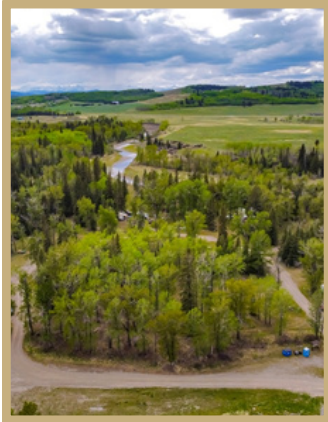

MRAS LIFE MEMBERSHIP PROCESS & CRITERIA



The purpose of a life membership is to honor our volunteers who have gone above and beyond for the betterment of MRAS. In this way, we hope to preserve and perpetuate the historical heritage of the society.

The following is the process for nominating a life member, reviewing the nomination and awarding a life membership.

1. Nominations for life membership must be submitted to the Millarville Historical Society (MHS) by August 15 of the current year.
2. A nomination letter for lifetime membership is put forward to the MHS from someone who knows the nominee well and believes they are worthy of becoming a life member. Nominations should be in the form of a letter or email and should be supported by additional letters of reference.
3. The MHS, with support from the historical Board liaison, reviews the nomination to ensure the individual meets the criteria and is deserving of lifetime member status.
4. The MHS contacts the nominee to obtain written agreement for the nomination prior to submission to the Board for approval.
5. Once agreement to the nomination is received from the nominee, all the criteria have been met. The MHS submits a letter or e-mail, along with any additional information the MHS deems necessary, to the Board requesting the person be given the honour of life member status.
6. The Board reviews the application and requests additional information or clarifications as it deems necessary. Once all questions are answered, the Board either accepts or denies the application. The historical Board liaison notifies the MHS of the Board's decision.
7. The MHS notifies the nominee and nominator of the Board's decision.
8. The nominee is honored at the next Volunteer Appreciation Night with a copy of the nomination letter, a congratulatory letter from the MRAS President, a framed certificate and life member pin.
9. An article honoring the new life member, provided by the MHS, is posted in Track Watch that includes biographical information and a photo provided by the new life member.

Exceptions

With Board acceptance, there have been exceptions made to the life membership criteria. Each case is reviewed on an individual basis and final Board acceptance is required for all exceptions.

Criteria

1. A holder of a paid MRAS general membership for a cumulative total of a minimum of 10 years
2. Accumulation of 50 or more volunteer points as per point system
3. Any meritorious person at the discretion of the MHS

Point System

President of Main Board - 5 points
Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary - 5 points
Board Member - 4 points
Board members volunteering on sub-committees - 1 point/sub-committee
Event Chairman, Secretary, Treasurer - 3 points
Event Section Manager - 2 points
Volunteer per MRAS Activity - 1 point

Notes:

The above criteria were approved by the Main Board and advised the Millarville Historical Society of their decision in March 2015.

Amendment for nomination date and additional discretion of the Board effective July 2018.

Amendment to membership criteria and removal of age requirement effective October 2021.



MILLARVILLE HISTORICAL SOCIETY

John and Ethel Fulton and Family

John Fulton was born about 1868 in the north of England. He married Ethel Mary Davidson in 1868 at Newcastle-on-Tyne, Northumberland. John and Ethel and their four young children came to Canada in July of 1906 on the *Tunisian*, one of the ships of the Allan Line Steamship Co. Their children were: Douglas (b. 1894); Mary Duff "Molly" (b. 1896); Isobel Norah (b. 1898) and John Jr. (b. 1904). Upon arrival in Calgary the family stayed at the Alberta Hotel until the George Bell family, who would become their neighbours, invited them to stay with them.

John homesteaded the south half of Section 36, Twp. 20 R4, W5. He also purchased the northeast quarter of the same section; the NW ¼ Section 30 Twp 20 R3 W5; and 80 acres of NE1/4 Section 25 Twp 20 R4 W5. John also had two leases one to the west. These holdings constituted "Springhill Ranch". Douglas homesteaded NE Section 30 Twp. 20, R3 W5. Their daughter Molly later recalled that her father chose a beautiful site for their home, perched just above the woods along the north bank of the creek. From there, they enjoyed sweeping views of the North Fork of Sheep Creek (now Threepoint Creek) to the southeast and the Rocky Mountains rising to the west. Although they dug 70 feet in search of water, the well ran dry, and the family was forced to haul barrels from a spring half a mile to the north using a stone boat. Molly remembered that in their first year they put up 100 pounds of wild strawberry jam. Gooseberries, saskatoons, and raspberries grew in abundance nearby, while wild cranberries were gathered deeper in the foothills. In those early days, the family obtained their butter from the Thomas Adams family, who lived farther south along the creek. Molly soon learned to make butter herself from sweet cream. After churning, she shaped it with wooden paddles into molds, always producing a bowl filled with neat little squares, rounds, and triangles.

In the spring of 1907 John imported from England a Thoroughbred stallion named Impulse, and a Thoroughbred mare named Quick Witted who was in foal to another stallion in England. Impulse took First and Championship at a Calgary Exhibition and Quick Witted's second foal Impunity came in second in the Alberta Derby. The Fulton family also had a small herd of heavy horses and a Clydesdale stallion and a herd of half thoroughbred mares to breed to Impulse. At one point John's herd numbered 300 head. These horses made wonderful polo ponies. The family also kept a small herd of cattle. A homesteader, Arthur Read, who lived two miles to the south (SW Section 30), was the hired man for the Fultons and the Basilicis. John Fulton paid him a wage of \$50 per month. In the early days before their homestead was fenced the children led many of the stock down to the water chute at the creek. Their Holstein cow often pulled the children along over buckbrush and sagebrush in her enthusiasm to get to the creek. It was an eight-mile ride down the creek to collect mail from the post office at Malcolm Millar's. John had purchased a pony from Malcolm for the children—a pony that quickly became a favourite. In addition to the post office, Malcolm also operated a small store. From time to time, John would drive Ethel to the Millar's, where she enjoyed tea with Mrs. Millar and other women of the district.

Eventually, a post office was established at Kew, operated by William and George Edgerton, who also ran a store. In 1918, the Edgerton brothers sold the business to Mark and Bert Hodgkins. The Kew post office was located about three-quarters of a mile south of the Fulton homestead, on the south side of the creek. In 1911, John was appointed Justice of the Peace for Kew, a position he held until 1914. During his tenure, he settled numerous local disputes, served as a commissioner of oaths, and, following the discovery of oil, took a keen interest in protecting the rights of local settlers.

The Fulton family took great pleasure in the social and recreational life of the district. They became acquainted with the Basilici family, who lived about a mile west of their homestead, and the three Basilici girls—Elizabeth (Lizzie), Jane, and Nina—soon formed close friendships with the Fulton children. They all looked forward to the annual picnics held at the ranches of W.H. King and Malcolm Millar. They rode on horseback to polo matches and drove to the tennis courts for games and gatherings. When visiting clergymen came to preach at Ranchers' Hall on Fisher Creek, they were always welcomed as guests in the Fulton home. The family also provided accommodations for polo players and their horses when they came to participate in local tournaments.

Molly recalled a comical event that occurred when her dad's sister, Harriet, came out from England to stay with them. Her mother and Aunt Harriet decided to ride over to the Walter Phillips' for a visit. In order to ford the creek, they safely led one horse across with Mrs. Fulton on it, but when it came to their Aunt Harriet a problem arose as she was wearing a very tight skirt. Harriet solved the problem by laying along the horse's back with her feet sticking out beyond its tail – it was very funny, but she managed to stay on despite her precarious position.

On August 4, 1914, Great Britain declared war on Germany, and as a British Dominion, Canada was automatically drawn into the conflict. Like many young men of the time, Douglas Fulton answered the call to serve. On August 2, 1915, at the age of 21, he signed his Attestation Paper in Calgary and joined the Canadian Expeditionary Force (Regimental Number 467091). Life continued at the Kew ranch, but in Douglas's absence John found the work increasingly difficult. Coupled with the poor prices being fetched for horses at the time, the situation became too discouraging, and in 1918 he decided to sell. The ranch was purchased by Warren Bucher for \$21 per acre, and the Fulton family subsequently moved to Victoria, B.C.

John Fulton passed away in 1933 at Chemainus, B.C. Ethel Fulton passed away in 1939 at Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Douglas married Harriet May "Molly" Trevenan in 1919. Douglas passed away on December 3rd, 1939 at the young age of 45 at Chemainus, B.C. Mary Duff "Molly" Fulton married John Compton Balleny in 1925. She passed away on October 13th, 1982 at the age of 76 in Victoria, B.C. Isobel married Edward "Teddy" Deane-Freeman. She passed away October 28, 1969 at the age of 71 at Kelowna. John Jr. moved to Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. He apprenticed with Westinghouse and later married. He passed away at Pittsburgh.
